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On January 10, 2020, at 01:21 hours, Officer Crist and I were dispatched to the area of 3001-3003 Cedarcliff Circle for a disturbance call. The caller could hear what sounded like someone banging on a door, and reported seeing her neighbors vehicles windows had been busted out.

Once Officer Crist and I arrived, we made contact with the residents at 3003 Cedarcliff. I noticed both vehicles parked at this address had multiple windows busted out and there was glass and plastic debris on the ground around both vehicles.

Upon entering the residence, I made contact with a Hispanic male who was standing just inside the front door with a dish towel wrapped around his right hand. He had an apparent laceration to his index and middle finger on his right hand, which I later learned was the result of him busting the car windows out of each vehicle in a fit of rage.

I also noticed a Hispanic female and a small child in the bedroom. The female was crying and asked us to get her husband out of the house. At that time, the male who was later identified as Luis Alfonso Lopez, held both hands out in front of him as if he expected to be handcuffed. I secured him in handcuffs which were checked for spacing before being double locked, and then escorted him outside where we waited for EMS crews to arrive and treat his wounds.

While waiting there, I could smell the strong odor of an alcoholic beverage on Luis' person. Luis' english was broken, but I understood that they were arguing because he recently found out his wife had an affair with one of his friends. Luis mentioned something about his wife suspecting he was cheating on her with one of his co-workers, but that was about the extent of our conversation.

Officer Crist stepped outside and asked Luis where his wife's phone was. Luis told her it was inside the house on the ground. He further advised he broke her phone and also admitted to smashing their car windows out with a hammer, but denied ever putting hands on his wife. Luis never mentioned anything that would suggest his wife threatened him with bodily harm or attempted to cause him to be injured.

Luis was treated at the scene by medics, and declined additional treatment at a hospital. I then secured Luis in the back seat of my patrol vehicle, while I photographed the scene.

I took several digital photos of the damaged vehicles, cell phones, and hammer used by Luis to damage both. I spoke briefly with the victim, Diamond Lopez, and did not see any sign of injury to her. Diamond did however tell me that she was afraid of her husband and feared he might try to hit her with the hammer if she attempted to stop him from damaging their vehicles. Diamond further advised she told Luis to give her her cell phone so she could call the police, but he refused and broke both of their cell phones instead. Diamond said she locked herself in her room with their two small children and just hoped the neighbors would call 911.

Luis was transported to the Montgomery County jail where he was booked N/C for disrupting public services.

On January 10, 2020 at approximately 0120 Officer Dexter and I were dispatched to a suspicious call at 3001 Cedarcliff. The complainant advised that she heard loud banging and that her dogs were barking, but that she wasn't sure if someone was banging on her door or somewhere else. While enroute, dispatch said that there was a male outside yelling in the driveway that was attached to hers.

Upon my arrival, I saw that the residence the complainant was speaking of was 3003 Cedarcliff. Two vehicles were parked in the driveway, and as I approached the front door, I could see that the windows of the vehicles had been smashed out. The remaining glass in the frames was still crackling, and the ground was covered in glass pieces. I knocked on the door of 3003 Cedarcliff, and heard what sounded like the door from the garage to the house slam. The front door opened, and a Hispanic male, later identified as Luis Alfonso Lopez Antemate answered the door. He was wearing shorts and a T-shirt and I saw that he had blood on both hands and a towel wrapped around his right hand. I asked him what was going on and he said that they were just arguing. I asked who he was arguing with, and he said his wife. The bedroom door opened up and a female, later identified as Diamond Lopez, was in a towel and yelled to take him away because he was crazy. Officer Dexter and I stepped inside and Officer Dexter placed Luis in handcuffs and requested a medic for his hand injury. Diamond said she needed her phone, and when i asked Luis where it was, he said "I smashed it." Diamond started crying and went into the bedroom.

I went to the bedroom and spoke with Diamond. She was now dressed, but was crying hysterically. I asked her what had happened, and she said that Luis had come home from soccer drunk around 2300. They had gotten into an argument about some past issues and Luis had told her that he was leaving. She told him that he was not taking either car because he had been drinking and both cars were in her name, and hid the car keys. She said that she got into the shower, and heard some loud banging. She went to the front door and saw him smashing the windows to the vehicles with a hammer. She yelled at him to stop and told him that she was calling the police. He said "call them." Diamond realized that he had her phone, and when she told Luis to give it to her he said no and continued to smash the windows of the two cars. Diamond said that she was afraid that he would hit her with the hammer, so she locked herself in the bedroom and then we showed up. While we were talking, the bedroom door next to hers opened and their son Luis Jr. (03-31-16) waked out into the hallway rubbing his eyes. Also in that room but still asleep was Ziannah Lopez (08-30-11.)

Diamond said that he did not hit her, nor did he threaten her. She said that she thought he would have hit her with the hammer if she would have gone out there. When I asked if there was any history of violence, Diamond described an incident that occurred two months ago when they had gotten into an argument because Luis wanted to look at her phone. She said that he had pushed her and wrestled with her to get it from her and then thrown the phone in the toilet. She got it out of the toilet and went into the bedroom, and Luis came after her again, grabbing her and shoving her up against the wall. She said that she was able to break free from his grasp and lock herself into the bathroom. Diamond said Luis kicked the door in, grabbed her phone and broke in half. The police were not notified. She also said that several years ago he had given her two black eyes and "busted up" her face, but she did not receive any medical treatment and the police were not notified.

Diamond said that she is afraid that Luis would try to kill her, but that he is only this bad when he is drinking. She said that he is a very jealous person, wants to know where she is at all times, and will check to see if she is where she says she is. She again said that he only gets violent when he is drinking, but that has been occurring more lately.

Diamond's sister arrived on scene while Diamond was filling out a statement. Diamond was given the Domestic Violence Hotline number, and encouraged to call. She was also given information on a protection order.

Officer Dexter photographed the scene, and transported Luis to Montgomery County Jail.

Detective Reider was notified of the incident.

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On the morning of Friday, January 10, 2020, Detective J. Rieder called me and asked me to assist him in this in-custody case. I read the report and then drove to 3003 Cedarcliff Circle in Butler Township, Montgomery County, Ohio, and spoke with Diamond J. Lopez.

I asked Lopez about her relation ship with Luis A. Lopez-Antemate as I was unsure due to the hyphenated last name. Diamond stated that in the Hispanic culture, the male takes the last names of both his father and mother. In her case she only had Luis' last name, the last name of his father. I also learned that they are still married and the two children are their children. I confirmed that Luis did not threatened to harm or harm Diamond. Diamond was clear in stating that Luis did not harm her or threatened to harm her. I asked and learned that the two cellular telephones were the only means to telephone; there was no land line in the home.

I emailed Diamond and asked if she became aware that Luis had her phone before or after he began to smash the windows of their commonly owned vehicles. Diamond replied that she became aware of the fact after he began to smash the windows. I returned to the Cedarcliff address and continued my conversation with Diamond who stated that at no time did she attempt to call the police, 911, or for help. When Diamond concluded showering, she heard the noise she looked outside to see Luis damaging their vehicles. She cracked the door open enough to informed him that she was gong to call the police and he replied to go ahead. It was only then that she realized her cellular telephone was missing and she asked him to return her cellular telephone to her.

I asked Diamond about the previous allegation of domestic violence. She relayed that during the early days of November, 2019, Luis had grabbed her in order to take away her cellular telephone as he suspected that she was cheating on him. I asked why she did not report it previously and she replied that he did not hurt her and she isn't one to call the police unless it's serious.

I went to the Vandalia Municipal Court and spoke with Prosecutor Caldwell and informed him of the recent events as well as those occurring in November. I asked if he would accept domestic violence charges for the November 2019 event. He stated that he would not.

On Monday, January 13, 2020, I presented the case to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office who refused the disrupting public service charge. I am closing the case.
