NARRATIVE
Victim's vehicle was stolen as it was left running and unattended near pump #7. The suspect was watching the pumps from inside the gas station, and passed by the victim as she entered the store.

NARRATIVE SUPPLEMENT

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On April 15, 2020, at 22:35 hours, I was dispatched to the Speedway gas station, which is located at 6501 Miller Lane, for a stolen vehicle report.

Dispatch advised the victim left her vehicle running near one of the gas pumps, and within a few minutes, an unknown suspect stole it. The vehicle stolen was a black 2016, Honda Accord, 2 door coupe, bearing Ohio registration HYQ8760.

Officer Hawkins made initial contact with the victim, who was identified as Marjorie Ryan. Ms. Ryan initially believed she left her key fob with house keys in the vehicle, but later discovered they were in fact in her purse. The vehicle was however left running, which allowed the suspect to drive away even without the key fob in the car. Note: Officer Hawkins researched that particular make and model of vehicle, and discovered it will continue to run until it either runs out of gas or the suspect turns it off.

Ms. Ryan advised her gas warning light came on as she was leaving the Miamisburg area, and she drove to the Speedway to refuel. She estimated the vehicle would run out of gas in roughly 30 miles or less.

When Ms Ryan exited her vehicle at pump #7, she left it running and entered the store to pick up a couple of items and pay for her gas. I asked Ms. Ryan if she recalled seeing anyone standing around when she exited her vehicle, and she stated no, but also said she really wasn't paying much attention. When she approached the cashier and tried to pay for gas on pump #7, was advised it was already in use. That is when Ms. Ryan realized her vehicle was gone.

Ms. Ryan described her vehicle being in excellent condition, with the only damage being a minor dent on the drivers side rear quarter panel, which was hardly noticeable. Ms. Ryan advised the vehicle was in stock condition with no added features or stickers of any kind.

I advised dispatch to enter the stolen vehicle into L.E.A.D.S. as soon as possible, and put out a countywide BOLO for the same.

Speedway's General Manager, Kevin Hoch was contacted by phone and agreed to come to the store to in order to provide us access to their surveillance system. It should be noted that the time listed on the video is approximately eight minutes fast, and any time mentioned from this point on will reflect the actual time.

Upon reviewing the video, Ms. Ryan's vehicle entered the lot and parked next to pump #7 at approximately 22:31 hours. As she entered the store, she is passed by the suspect who had been waiting just inside the front doors since approximately 22:02 hours. The suspect walks out to the pumps and walked around her vehicle on the passenger side toward the rear of the vehicle, before opening the drivers door and hopping in. The suspect exited the parking lot onto Commerce Center Drive which is on the west side of the building.

The suspect is wearing a light colored, surgical style mask over his mouth and nose, and he has the hood of his dark blue or possibly black sweatshirt pulled over his head, but I could still see his hands and enough of his face to tell that he is a black male with light to medium brown skin complexion. The suspect is wearing a pair of stone washed skinny jeans, and black or dark gray sneakers with light, possibly green striped accents. The suspect appeared to be in his late teens to mid twenties, with an average build.

At one point in the video, the suspect pulled his mask down enough that it exposed his nose and mouth. I took a photo of this image from the monitor and forwarded it to Officers Hawkins and Smith who were canvassing the area, in case they came across the vehicle or suspect on foot.

I made contact with the Brosnan Security Officer who was working at Walmart. When I showed him a still photo of the suspect, he said it looked like one of the Walmart employees that was working tonight. He advised the employee he was thinking of was bringing in the carts from the parking lot.

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I then made contact with the two night managers, who are new to this store and were not able to access the surveillance system for me at that time. I showed both managers the same still photo of my suspect. One of the managers stated she the suspect looked like the guy who was working outside this evening collecting shopping carts.

At my request, the name of this employee was provided, however, no other information such as age, address, phone number etc. could be provided at this time.

Until the surveillance video from Walmart and be viewed by myself or other BTPD officer, the name of this employee will not be included in this report.

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On April 16, 2020, Dayton PD Detective McReynolds notified me that Dayton had two related incidents to our two stolen vehicles (this case, and #20-027336) at the Shell gas station on Stanley Avenue. The first was an attempted GTA where the suspect got out of a black Honda Accord and attempted to take another vehicle, but was not successful. The second incident was a completed GTA where the Shell video shows a black Honda Accord and a silver VW Jetta (matching the description of our other stolen from case #20-027336) enter the lot, and another male got out of the Accord and stole a black Honda CRV, LIC/HJD8719. Thus there are at least three suspects involved in this ring that stole at least three cars overnight.

Det. McReynolds said the victim of the attempted GTA from their Shell may be able to identify the suspect that tried to take their car.

Nothing further at this time.
